Equalization Study

According to 32 V.S.A. § 5405, "Annually, on or before April 1, the Commissioner shall determine the equalized education property tax grand list and coefficient of dispersion for each municipality in the State."

As part of this annual Equalization Study process, towns are asked to assist by validating sales. This process is currently accomplished online using the Tax Department web portal myvTax. Towns are paid \$1.00 per grand list parcel to assist in this process (known as the Equalization Study Payment).

If your town has outstanding sales that are not validated by October 1, PVR will be validating these sales. This is due to time sensitive nature of this statutory process.

Once this year's sales are validated, the information is combined with validated sales information from the prior two years of sales to calculate the Common Level of Appraisal and the Coefficient of Dispersion for each municipality. Assessing Software Input

PVR is aware that the CAMA systems from multiple vendors (NEMRC MicroSolve, VISION, ProVal, etc.) are currently in use by Vermont towns. We are interested in finding out specifically which CAMA system each town uses to better understand the total scope of CAMA usage. Homestead Declarations and State Payments

Please continue downloading your homestead declarations on a regular schedule and send an adjusted bill to the property owner if need be.

News You Can Use

Backup and Restore Points

Just a reminder, please remember how important it is to backup both your grand list and CAMA systems frequently. It is also important to backup to more than one place. In other words, you should back up to your hard drive in addition to a backup offsite (ie NEMRC and a hard drive you either transport off site or place in the vault). If you subscribe to NEMRC to perform nightly backups, make sure you know whether you are paying for -- grand list backups, CAMA MicroSolve backups or both and what files are included.

You can perform backups in NEMRC two ways:

- 1. On the main screen choose O. NEMRC Backup. This backs up your grand list only.
 - To back up to your hard drive, choose the 3rd option in the list. If you have a network drive and want to back up to that, choose Option 4 and specify the drive you want.
 - To back up off- site either backup to NEMRC (option 1) or Option 4 and choose your external drive etc.
- 2. On the main screen choose "H" for Restore Points. This will create a backup on your hard drive with a description you pick. Choose "Create a Restore Point" and name it, then click create. An example might be 2018 Preliminary as Lodged.

To create a backup in MicroSolve:

Choose Tools, then NEMRC backup. This will back up your MicroSolve <u>data only</u>. All options will be the same as for NEMRC.

If you use a different CAMA system, please consult with their helpdesk to make sure you understand how to use backup that data.

Make this a routine! If a disaster or computer virus hits your system you will be glad you did!

Current Use

Current Use exchanges will continue until your town's files are 100% certified - remember it's a work in progress! Keep sending the file back and forth until 100% certified from Current Use. Don't forget to complete Step #5 and load the values into your grand list. Once the file is 100% certified, you will only resend to Current Use when a change is made.

Continue to download in your 2018 Billed Grand List on a regular schedule and send an adjusted bill to the property owner if need be.

Program FYIs and Dates:

2019 Annual Certification for Agricultural Land and Farm Buildings

On Monday, September 10, 2018, the Annual Certification for Agricultural Land and Buildings (Form CU-313) were mailed to landowners in the current use program who have active agricultural land or buildings enrolled in the program that are required to submit an annual certification. These were mailed to the owner's address on file. Form CU-313 is a pre-printed form with specific parcel information maintained by the Department. No generic form is available.

How to Certify

A landowner must complete, sign, and either postmark or hand deliver Form CU-313, by November 1.

Current Use withdrawals/ discontinuances

Current use withdrawals are processed through the myVTax application. You will be alerted via email when you have LUCT (Land Use Change Tax/Penalty) value requests in myVTax. Please log into your myVTax account as soon as possible where you will be asked to determine a value for the land being removed from the program. Please be mindful that by statute, listers/assessors have thirty (30) days to submit the completed form to the Director 32 VSA 3757(b).

Remember to send a copy of the form (LV-314) to the taxpayer along with the Letter of Explanation (link in form LV-314). If the value is then appealed, let current use know immediately. The appeals process for land use change tax/ penalty is the same as all other grand list value appeals.

Please also be aware that these discontinuances may trigger the need to issue a revised tax bill.
